ECHO SUMMIT LODGE REPORT ANNUAL REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 2013 ANNUAL MEETING: APRIL 27, 2013

Ray Sommer, Echo Summit Lodge Treasurer for 29 years, and Trustee for 31 years is retiring and will be missed by all of us and the many CAC members he has worked with over his career with Echo Lodge and CAC. An informal celebration to honor Ray will be held Sunday, May 5th, 1-4 pm, at Alpine Lodge. All are invited to attend. Ray has been transitioning his responsibilities to Diane Ryan, new ESL Treasurer.

The primary project at Echo Lodge for the past year was replacing the retaining wall in front of the parking lot. This entailed moving the propane tank, excavating with heavy equipment, building the wall, backfilling, pouring a concrete pad for the propane tank, moving the tank back to the new pad, and re-connecting the gas line to the lodge building. As usual, the permit process was very slow but we managed to almost finish the project in 2012 and get permit approval. With an early snowfall, we did not get the tank moved back and re-connected. This final step will be completed at the May 2013 Spring Work Party. The cost-to-date is \$18.5K.

The next significant project will be the ADA bathroom/dorm remodel. Architect Jerry Wagner has completed the plans to submit for USFS and then El Dorado County approval. Since this is an interior project, we hope to complete it in the Fall, 2013. We have budgeted \$35K but will need bids for a better estimate. We expect to have ample funds available for this project and maintain our \$50K minimum reserve balance, assuming no significant estimate deviation.

The early snow brought folks to Echo Lodge even though it was not a good snow season in total. Usage at the lodge increased 8% over the prior year as did revenue from meals and lodging. Donations in memory of Onnie Taylor totaled \$2,168. Our net income from operations was \$30K, 40% or \$8.6K over last year. Note that the net income would have been \$2.4K lower except billing for land use tax was delayed so there may be 2 years payments in FYE 3-31-14.

Our Cash balance increased \$14.8K to \$74.3K. Our goal is to carry \$50K in reserves. Non-operating spending included \$17K for the retaining wall and \$5K for a kitchen stove fire suppression system.
