

Different Hikes for Different Types: Our Weekly Tradition for Sunday Hiking

Rain Cancels All Hikes!

Our 2B hikes depart from the California Alpine Club (CAC) at 9:30 a.m. These hikes are 7-10 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 2,000 ft. When there is no leader specified for a given Sunday, the convened hikers at the CAC will decide upon their own route.

A more informal, slower paced hike – designated as 1A – will depart from the CAC at 9:45 a.m. These hikes are typically 5-6 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 1,000 ft.

Please remember to bring a light lunch (e.g., a sandwich) and at least a liter of water. All hikers should have prior hiking experience and be able to maintain a moderate pace (i.e., approximately two miles per hour). The hikes usually finish at the CAC around $2:00-3:00~\rm p.m.$

Note: Hike group safety protocols prevail. If you want to hike in front of the leader, please inform the leader. If given permission, you must stop at any intersection or junction and wait for the group. You must also be within earshot in case the group is held up. If you do not follow these steps, we will no longer consider you part of the group.

In the upcoming Trails, you will see that your Outings committee is hard at work putting together another exciting year of outdoor adventures with weekend car camping, a base camp in the Sierras, a possible river raft trip and a summer backpack that leads to our own Echo Lodge.

I would like to toss out an action-packed idea, climbing Mt. Shasta. With winter storms bringing record snowfall to our mountains, Mt. Shasta is currently blanketed with a snow pack that is 197% above normal...and it's only January! This will be an ideal year to climb Mt. Shasta, with enough snow to extend the climbing season and still avoid climbing in loose exposed scree. I want to put together a small group to climb the West Face route to the summit. This is a spectacular 3-day route that is appropriate for both first-time and experienced climbers.

2017 OUTINGS IN THE WORKS

The Outings Committee has been hard at work planning exciting opportunities for members (and potential members!) to experience the endless natural beauty that surrounds us here in the Bay Area.

2017 started with a terrific turnout (32 members and friends) January 14 for lunch in downtown San Francisco and an excursion through Yerba Buena Center for the Arts, followed by a CAC Group tour of the Fisher Collection at the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art (SFMOMA), organized by **Vicki Olds**. Look for pictures and tales of their adventure in the March Trails.

April 7-9, **Ernie Castiaux** will lead a 3-day/2 night car camping & hiking trip to Pinnacles National Park, timed to enjoy the magnificent Spring wildflowers that blanket the park at this time of year. Ernie's hikes are rated 2+C, slightly more challenging than the Sunday Alpine Lodge hikes. To register for this trip, contact Ernie at ecastiaux@hotmail.com.

Sandy Borden has offered to organize a half-day river raft trip on the East Fork of the Carson River, Cave Rock to Hangman's Bridge. The East Fork Carson is free-flowing, not dam controlled, so picking a date will be based on weather and snow melt, probably sometime in May. Look for a description and prices in the April Trails. If we're lucky, we'll tie the river trip into a stop at Echo Lodge, depending on availability when the river levels are right for a trip.

Sandy Borden will also lead a three-day backpack trip from Big Meadow to Echo Summit Lodge, July 22-24. Approximately 20 miles start to finish, the route leads through meadows, along creeks and into dense stands of pine, fir and aspen. As we'll be hiking to almost 9000 feet elevation, it's a good idea to go early and acclimate before you start the trek. Why not attend **Mary Cahill's** Wildflower Event at Echo Summit (July 16-22) and then join Sandy at the trailhead? The backpack trip is free, and there will be an opportunity to rest up at Echo for a night before heading home (standard rates apply). Look for more information in the March Trails.

Steven Smith will lead an August base camp trip with mules to carry your camping gear. Destination and dates to be determined. Stay tuned!

And finally, we are hoping to put together a trip to Oregon to experience the total solar eclipse on August 21st. Group sites near Madras, Oregon have all been reserved by the Oregon Parks Service for their own events. However, some of the first come/first served sites will be opened for reservations at some point in the future (date unknown at this writing). Here is a description from the Shasta Mountain Guides website:

This route is an excellent climb for mountaineers looking for a moderate, less visited climb to Shasta's summit. Our base camp in Hidden Valley 9,200 ft. is spectacular and well positioned for the summit push. A beautiful, more remote climb for those seeking a true Wilderness experience. Comparable technical challenge to Avalanche Gulch and ideal for new and experienced climbers.

Our climb would be late June or early July, depending on availability of dates. The cost would depend on the number of climbers. At this point, I would simply like to know if you would be seriously interested in making this climb. A couple of things that might help you decide one way or the other:

Previous mountaineering experience is not required, but you MUST be in excellent physical condition. If you're not in peak condition now, there is time, and there are resources to learn how to train for a climb. We could even plan some increasingly challenging weekend training hikes to support each other in achieving our goal!

Most of the technical equipment needed for the climb can be rented. I will share the equipment list with anyone who requests it.

We would travel with Shasta Mountain Guides, Mt. Shasta's oldest and most respected outfitter.

The cost for the outfitter would be in the range of \$745, depending on the size of the group.

Once we commit as a group, we are committed. A 50% non-refundable deposit is required to reserve the dates. So now's the time to think about it and ask questions.

So what say you? Have you always harbored a secret dream to scale that big, glorious mountain but didn't know anyone crazy enough to join you? Would you like to challenge yourself to climb one of California's highest, most beautiful peaks in the company of your fellow CAC members? If so, please email me at: renee@fallbrook.net. At this point, I'm just trying to gauge your interest in this sort of adventure. If enough of you let me know you would seriously consider climbing this year, I will put together a trip with firm dates and cost, at which point you can make your decision to join this once-in-a-lifetime adventure.
