The California Alpine Club (CAC) is an outdoors-oriented social club with special interests in outdoor education and environmental protection. The CAC offers an interesting variety of travel outings along with events and activities centered in its two Lodges. Both Lodges have kitchens, private bedrooms, and dormitory facilities that are available for the use of Members and Associate Members at CAC events. The CAC activities are listed in the newsletter, TRAILS, which is published 10 times each year and is posted on our web site calalpineclub.org. The Lodges are available to Members (as scheduling permits) for private accommodations, weddings, business meetings, and family reunions. CAC is also active in local conservation works and the **CAC Foundation** makes grants regularly to support numerous environmental causes. Total membership is under 1000. Family membership is encouraged.

ALPINE LODGE is located on the south slope of Mt. Tamalpais, at 730 Panoramic Highway, Mill Valley, California 94941 (about one quarter mile from the Mountain Home bus stop). The Lodge is available for the use and enjoyment of our Members. It is not available for public rentals. To contact someone staying at the Lodge call **415-388-9940**. The Lodge is open to Members every Sunday offering scheduled hikes, hospitality, and refreshments. Revenue from lodging and CAC events provides funds for maintenance and improvements.

ECHO SUMMIT LODGE is located at the summit of Old Meyers Grade above Lake Tahoe, one mile from U.S. 50 at 9010 Johnson Pass Road. The phone number is **530-659-7274**. It is a large, comfortable, year-round mountain Lodge in the Sierra Nevada at an elevation of 7,365 feet. The Lodge commands a superb view of Lake Tahoe Basin and surrounding mountains. Forty thousand acres of rugged granite peaks and the Alpine Lakes of Desolation Valley Wilderness Area are within easy walking distance for hikers, mountaineers, and fishermen. Echo Lake, a mile from our Lodge, is a delightful place in the summer for swimming, fishing, and boating. In winter, the area excels for ski touring and snowshoeing. Nearby well-known downhill ski areas include Heavenly Valley, Sierra at Tahoe, and Kirkwood.

MAINTENANCE & OPERATION

Members, on a volunteer basis, perform the management, maintenance and operation of both Lodges, insofar as possible.

MEMBERSHIP EXPECTATIONS

Members are expected to contribute time and energy at least once a year to maintain and operate our Lodges. Alpine Lodge has mid-week and Sunday work parties. Echo Lodge has periodic multi-day work parties. Coordinating a major event, cooking a large dinner, editing TRAILS, accepting a leadership position, participating in special projects, etc., also satisfies this work obligation.

All Members are expected to perform some type of work activity at least once a year.

Former Members may be reinstated without an entry fee within five years of the date their membership lapsed. Reinstated Members are exempt from the requirement made of new Members to attend two CAC events prior, however, all Members are expected to perform at least one work activity as approved by the CAC leadership.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SPONSORS

1. To inform the applicant(s) of the purposes of the CAC, how the club operates, and how the lodges are maintained and financed.
2. To encourage the applicant(s) to become the active Member(s) that the CAC needs for continued success.
3. To explain the work activity requirement/commitment and to help arrange the work party or activity for the applicant(s).
4. To bring and introduce new Members at one of the New Member Dinner events.
