PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members of the California Alpine Club,

Thank you very much for the valuable and creative comments and suggestions that you sent in response to my November TRAILS President's Message on volunteerism. In reviewing the many responses I found these central themes:

- Charge more (for dues, activities, etc.) if needed
- Annual work participation for members should be required
- Higher dues and/or extra charges for members that don't participate
- Reward the hard workers with decreases in payments
- Flexibility for work activities (more weekend work parties, self-directed work projects available)
- Recruit new members

I'd like to share with you a few excerpts from the messages I received:

- I was surprised that an annual work party wasn't part of our membership requirements.
- Make the price for non-volunteering substantial!
- How about a two-tiered membership fee? Fees staying where they are for those who are workers and a fee 25-30% higher for those who wish to belong, but not contribute.
- Those who give generously of their time should pay less.
- I think we (the Club), should lose those non-contributing members before we ever consider ending volunteerism. If members won't volunteer then they should look for another type of club.
- It came as a shock to see how few people volunteered with the clean up after dinner. Can this be indicative of the mood of the members? Shame on us if it is.
- We use Echo several times a year, and don't do much at Alpine but we feel like it is a very important asset to our senior members who use it all the time and get so much enjoyment out of it.
- The Lodges are apples and oranges. People want to go skiing/hiking at Tahoe for a reasonable amount of money with people they enjoy, but Alpine doesn't have that same draw. So, as a Club, lets provide some extra support for Alpine Lodge through dues or whatever.
- We just spent the night at Alpine Lodge before a work party with two other families and had a great time.
- While one solution would be to raise dues another would be to broaden the demographic that you currently attract by welcoming new groups who enjoy the mountain including the burgeoning number of road and mountain
- The CAC might develop a nice looking gift certificate

CONSERVATION REPORT

Each year we raise money for the Conservation Fund begun a number of years ago by **Henry Hillman**. In the spring of the year, we disperse money from this fund to organizations that work to conserve our environment. I have news this month about fundraising, and success stories from two of the organizations to which we contributed earlier this year. We can deservedly feel a glow of achievement.

On November 5, the Alpine Lodge was the scene of a very fun and lucrative fund raiser. Jared Huffman, president of the Marin Municipal Water District, presented a program about exploring the use of a desalination plant as an answer to providing Marin water users with an adequate water supply. Ros Carol, our outings chair, has arranged for a fieldtrip in MMWD vans to see this in action. Next we scarfed down wonderful hors d'oeuvres and schlepped up drinks from our bar, organized by Ernie Pitz and tended by Hedde Thieme. Back in the Fellowship Hall, decorated by Sue Karp in the theme of the dinner, we enjoyed every bite of the Moroccan dinner cooked by Eva Libien with the help of able assistants. Twenty of us slept over. Susan Head and helpers prepared a hearty breakfast for us. The weather turned foul and we didn't journey out to Audubon Canyon Ranch as planned, the only negative of the weekend.

The Natural Resources Defense Fund is one of the most successful organization to obtain protections for our environment. Late in October it was able to facilitate an agreement that protects the world's last unspoiled gray whale nursery at San Ignacio Lagoon in Baja Mexico. What did that cost? \$1.5 million! Our dollars are a part of that.

Another recipient from our conservation fund is the Center for Sierra Nevada Conservation. One of its projects is working with the National Forest Service to contain the use of off-road vehicles in our national forests. This group sued the Forest Service to complete the task of setting up specific areas in Eldorado National Forest for off-road vehicle use and thus protecting the rest of the forest. More of our dollars put to good use.

I wish you all Happy Holidays! We can rest on our laurels until the New Year. Then we are back to protecting our environment though our work and contributions. Thank you to everyone who has helped.





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Early in December I received this e-mail from long-time member Peter Beckmann. I want to share it with you.

On Cooperating in the California Alpine Club

Dear fellow Alpiners,

As some of you might know, I am "temporarily" in New York City pursuing a PhD program in economics. It so happened that these weeks in class we are dealing with the "commodification" of modern life. Things that used to be free, given as gifts or simply done as favors between people are increasingly measured in terms of money value and transformed into paid transactions. Examples of this attitude are the notion that "time is money," the habit of returning gifts of similar value to the one received, being hesitant to ask neighbors for help in "raising the barn," ...and the current discussion about substituting work party participation in the CAC for higher fees.

Unfortunately, this is not just a change in procedures. It is a radical change in the values our club was founded upon. This proposed change goes so deep that it deserves some closer examination: what is happening when people come together to make something happen that they cherish and believe in? They are dealing directly with their fellow humans and their common aspirations and deepest values. In our club context, this means that I know that John is willing to sweat in order to provide for Echo's drinking water when I work next to him, that Eike is willing to give up many hours of personal time to create more community events in the club while I am cooking "for her," and that many more club members are always ready to give some of their precious time to advance the club's common cause.

Had I just paid my way out of my work party duties I would never have known the numerous fellow members who continuously make things happen. As an example, the water I drink at Echo would be just like the water that comes out of my faucet in New York City, brought to me by some anonymous service paid for by my monthly bill. In economics we call this phenomenon "alienation." We have lost touch with the sweat and the work that provides for our basic needs and instead mediate our involvement by paying a price.

And what a price we do pay! In some ways, we would be creating a class culture in our club: there are the ones that pay and the ones that work. As a result, the CAC would become increasingly segregated since we wouldn't have to meet any other members any more except the ones we choose to share leisure activities with. Wouldn't this start feeling like a "Club Med atmosphere?" I certainly like it the old way. I like to know to whom I owe the water at Echo, the editing of the newsletter, and the many-handed labor that makes this wonderful club possible.

Thus for me the only reasonable solution that preserves the club's values would be work party participation as a condition for continued membership. This wouldn't have to be a hardship: with 700 members and bi-annual work party duty, there would be 350 members available to work for the club while I have to show up only every other year. This doesn't sound too difficult.

And I would even come from New York!

A ROMP ACROSS ENGLAND: FROM THE MOUNTAINS TO THE SEA

Slide show, April 9, 2006

Join Susanna Van Leuven and Stuart Sparling on Sunday April 9 at 2:00 pm as they show slides and discuss their trip to England's Lake District, where they climbed Red Pike, a deceptively easy-looking mountain outside Buttermere. England's mountains, although not particularly high, are steep as can be. Coming down on sliding scree on an impossibly steep slope is an exercise in patience and nerves. It was a two-pint day.

We also hiked around Keswick, taking one of the passes to Buttermere, a hidden hamlet with two pubs, an ice cream place and a youth hostel. Join us for more adventures as we take you over the pass from Borrowdale to Grasmere, where the climbing went on and on and into bogs, leaving us in the fog unable to find our way. We were lucky to find a grandfather and grandson who led the way. Two other hikers, too proud to ask directions, barely made their way to Grasmere in the dense fog. They appeared later, exhausted and wiped out.

After messing about in the Lake District, we headed across England to hike the Cleveland Way, a 105 mile route from Helmsly to Filey. We walked up on Sutton Bank with 100 mile views and an aerodrome, across the top of the Cleveland Hills, stopping in Osmotherley, Malk Kiln House in Urra Moor, then along an old railroad bed to the tiny hamlet of Kildale, where they had one shop, where they served tea and cakes in a cosy place that was half underground. We also explored other little towns, ending up at the sea at Saltburn-by-the-Sea, which had a library as good as San Francisco's. We hiked miles along the cliff edge, hiking trails that lose width with each year. The five hundred foot drop off gave us pause from time to time. We explored Staithes, a wonderful town cut into the cliff, watched the Lifeboat festivities there at the Cod and Lobster pub, then meandered down to Scarborough and then onto Filey into a driving rain. Luckily we had reservations at Humnaby. We were picked up by the owner of the B & B and brought back to her hotel, where we spent the evening in an old manor house, resplendent with flowers, with a good pub and fine food, reminiscent of the best BBC English interiors.

A letter dated February 2, 1975 from Allen Wright, addressed to Dr. Budd Smith, Harry West and Ralph King regarding Echo Lodge:



CANOE TRIP TO THE OZARKS - MAY 7-13

Alpine Club canoeists will have a chance to explore two new rivers on May 7-13, 2006. The two rivers are reported to be among the most scenic in the country. According to Life Magazine, "the Jack Fork is one of world's 10 most scenic floating streams." The Jack Fork flows into the Current River, which Alpine paddlers visited three years ago.

Plans are to spend two-three days on the Jack Fork, and then drive to the nearby 11 Point River, which was one of the eight streams initially selected for status as "wild and scenic" when the designation was started back in 1968.

Both of these small rivers meander through the picturesque Ozark hills. There are steep bluffs and huge springs adding to the flow. Readers can check out both streams on the internet.

Camping will be primitive. Some river paddling experience is mandatory. The trip will be limited to 14 participants. If more than 14 apply, a lottery will be held. Cost is expected to be about \$250 per person, exclusive of flights. Paddlers will fly into the St. Louis airport and go to the rivers in rented vans. Round trip air from Oakland is about \$265.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I just received an e-mail from **Cindy Toran**, Echo Trustee, about the hosting schedule for the Echo Summit Lodge. Cindy coordinates all the Lodge events and since the schedule was booking up rapidly, she wanted to know if **Carroll Pearson** and I would like to reserve a spot for this summer.

Last year Carroll and I tried something new: we organized our hosting period as a Co-op Meal Week. We had heard that some hosts ask guests to cook a meal, and we thought we would experiment and have our whole week done that way. In case any of you might want to consider this approach, let me share our experiences with you.

The biggest concern, and our greatest fear, was that the bottom line would suffer. With each team doing their own planning and shopping for their one breakfast or dinner, it is easy to see how inefficiencies could occur. However, I am very pleased to report that inefficiencies were averted.

Carroll started the steady rounds of e-mails by explaining that we hoped to provide good, nutritious, tasty meals. No one was expected to skimp on his or her meal, but splurging on expensive ingredients was not needed for Echo's casual ambiance. Everyone got it.

We would provide some basic staples—milk, butter, etc., plus all the food for lunch—but they would bring, or buy at Tahoe, whatever they needed.

Guests started to sign up for meals for specific dates, with a description of what they were going to serve (chicken and roasted potatoes for Wednesday), and the remaining guests saw what was being served when, and chose their dates and dishes accordingly. It worked well. Everyone was cooperative and flexible, and a lot of excitement was generated about the food for the week.

We knew that people would provide too much food for their meal (What host wants to run out of food?), and so we planned for a refrigerator round-up breakfast and dinner to use everything up. It became evident by the second or third day that we were overflowing with leftovers. One of the guests was arriving late up at Echo with the food for her team, and so we called her off before she went shopping. Her teammate assessed the food supply, went to the store and did the minor supplementation that was needed, and one more great meal was served at Echo Summit Lodge.

For us, using up leftovers was key to keeping on budget. It might be wise to anticipate that after a couple of days, recycling would be in order.

Guests turned in their receipts to Carroll, which she used for calculating their final bill. The accounting was a bit more complicated for her, but not too bad.

Not only was the week a financial success, but we also noticed that a whole new sense of camaraderie existed. Everyone was more tuned-in to the meal prep and cleanup and acted with more of a vested interest. They wanted to give help because they hoped to receive help. Having everyone cook fostered an upbeat and supportive atmosphere. Guests really seemed to enjoy their turn in the kitchen—even if a bit nervous to follow the excellent meal that preceded theirs.

As hosts, we still had plenty to do. I was almost always in the kitchen and Carroll was usually somewhere between the kitchen and the host's desk.

Would we do it again this same way? Definitely.

CONSERVATION REPORT

In December, I spent a week in southern Florida. Conservation is alive there. Through a coalition of groups that represents all the interested parties and factions, the Everglades and the coral reefs are being saved even though it is an area of expanding population and growth. Wetlands are being preserved and the river of grass is flourishing again. The recent hurricanes have battered the man-made features, but natural flora and fauna actually benefit from hurricanes. The Biscayne National Park, which is over ninety-five percent water, features coral reefs that in the past have been ravished by fishing equipment. Now that it is protected, they are stabilizing. What is so exciting is the educational work that is being done by rangers and volunteers to make people aware of what a vital part of the ecosystem the Everglades and coral reefs are. They aren't just interesting tourist spots, but an integral part of having clean water and protecting the coastal lands from the invasion of salt water. More and more throughout our country people are realizing that conservation is not just a luxury item if we have extra money, but it is life and death to all of us.

During the past several years, **Laurence Kornfield** and others worked to establish a 503(c)(3) CAC Foundation. The purpose of this is to make the money donated to conservation a charitable donation for tax purposes for those who donated. The CAC Board during this past year has removed its support of the CAC Foundation. Winter is the time that your donations are usually dispersed to conservation groups. At this time this annual dispersion is on hold until the CAC Foundation question is settled.

I have been your Conservation Chair for almost three years. I have enjoyed the work. Through your fund-raisers and donations that we have passed along to groups that are active in conservation activities, I believe we have made a difference. Now it is time for me to join those who think of CAC more as a social club and become more active in these events. Thank you for all you have done for conservation, and for pitching in when I have asked for help.

A ROMP ACROSS ENGLAND: FROM THE MOUNTAINS TO THE SEA Slide show, April 9, 2006

Join us on Sunday April 9 at 2:00 pm as we show slides and discuss our hiking trip in England.

In England's Lake District, we climbed Red Pike, coming down on sliding scree on an impossibly steep slope, making it a two-pint day. We hiked around Keswick to Buttermere, a hidden hamlet. Hear more about our adventures as we take you over the pass to Grasmere, where the climbing led into bogs, leaving us in the fog unable to find our way, but lucky enough to find a grandfather and grandson who led us out.

After the Lake District, we headed across England to hike the Cleveland Way. We walked up on Sutton Bank with 100 mile views, across the top of the Cleveland Hills, stopping in Osmotherley, Malk Kiln House in Urra Moor, then hiked along an old railroad bed to the tiny hamlet of Kildale, with a shop where they served tea and cakes in a cosy place that was half underground.

At Saltburn-by-the-Sea we hiked miles along the cliff edge, though the five hundred foot drop off gave us pause from time to time. We explored Staithes, a town cut into the cliff, then meandered down to Scarborough and then onto Filey into a driving rain. Luckily we had reservations at Humnaby and spent the evening in an old manor house, resplendent with flowers, with a good pub and fine food, reminiscent of the best BBC English interiors.

CONSERVATION REPORT

California Alpine Club and the CAC Foundation have a new leader. Jay Hallberg stepped forth last November as a Foundation director to resolve the future of the CAC Foundation. He has accepted the responsibility of the Conservation Chair for CAC. MARBLE MOUNTAIN WILDERNESS LLAMA BASE CAMP


Friday-Tuesday, July 21-15

I slept in the Tam Building, which had sleeping porches for the men and a primitive bathroom in the basement (still there for you traditionalists). How times have changed! That members did most of the additions and improvements says a lot for the positive spirit of our club over all these years. Check out the plaque on the deck listing the folks that made its construction possible. Thank them and remember Matt Davis for all the good times we have enjoyed on Mount Tamalpais.


Echo Summit was different. Echo John (Hannum) knows about the history of Johnson Pass (our address there), as he has done research on it regarding water rights. Johnson built a toll road to supply the Nevada mines over this route, and pretty soon a roadhouse appeared where a teamster could get a shot of whiskey to wash down the trail dust. Years later, a gas station served the flivvers that struggled up the hairpin turns and steep grade from Meyers. Meals were served and rooms were rented. I hope John will tell us more about this historic inn, well watered by his efforts (pun intended), now in our club's care. Let's honor the past by keeping up the tradition of working on our lodges, or helping in some other way. There are many fun (really!) jobs that need doing that don't require strength or a lot of time. Just ask any of the officers, chairpersons or trustees (see box on this page) what you might do or what needs doing, and they will point you in the right direction. We are still a "can do" club, just as in the past.

WALKING THE SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA PILGRIMAGE TRAIL

Last June I walked the Santiago de Compostela pilgrimage trail, commonly called the Camino and walked by saints, sinners, and seekers for over 1000 years. On Saturday, June 3, I will give a talk and slide show for the California Alpine Club (details in the June 3-4 Hikers' Weekend article on page 5).

Although a lifelong athlete, I am not much of a hiker. What could have possessed me, alone and 67, to have embarked on this extreme journey? Once before, I had cycled alone halfway across this country. I wanted to re-create the connection with the earth, with God, the peace I had then. I wanted to step out of my nationality, my personality, my ego, to find who was underneath now, to think about my real purpose for the rest of my life. I'd walk 400 out of the 450 miles from St. Jean Pied de Port in the French Pyrennes, east to west across northern Spain, to Santiago over 42 days, with 33 walking days. It is said everyone who walks does their own Camino, their own Way.

I will tell you about mine, and how to do this, but you need to have a pretty good reason. I remember the places I almost quit, and the place I decided to go on. I'm on the Camino still, and images float in and out of my consciousness; waves of wind blowing across vast fields of grain, the deep green mountains of the Pyrennes, its valleys shrouded in fog, companions whose language I couldn't speak, the steaming café con leche at a village bar, the rhythm of my hiking poles, the hurting, the shared pilgrim bond with others in the albergues, the quiet forest paths, the sweeping views of receding blue ridges that I actually walked across, the hard sidewalks through cities, the little revelations that never came according to my time schedule but that were instead gifts of the long spaces in which to think, like a rare flower growing right beside the road. The Camino is a permanent part of me now, and I look forward to sharing it with you.



RATE CHANGE AT ECHO LODGE

As part of the annual budgeting process, Echo Trustee John Hannum developed the usual list of future projects with updated cost estimates. A major future project that must be completed prior to our 2011 Use Permit renewal with the US Forest Service is a wheelchair access ramp, along with significant exterior renovations. After more than 15 years, we have come to the point that the Lodge needs to earn more and/or spend less. Accordingly, Trustees reluctantly agreed to modestly raise rates for food (increase of \$1/day), lodging (increase varies from \$2-\$4/day), and weekend member rentals (increase \$7/person/day). We expect this rate program to generate an additional \$10K annually, balance our budget, and maintain our ability to fund the future projects.

Effective June 1st the rates for Echo Lodge usage will be as follows:

- Dorm/RV Bed: \$5
- Room Bed, multiple occupancy: \$10
- Room bed, single occupancy (if available): \$20
- Meals:
 - Breakfast \$4
 - Lunch \$4
 - Dinner \$8
 - Total per Day \$16
- Children:
 - Age 4-11: $\frac{1}{2}$ adult rates
 - Under age 4: no charge
- Member Rentals
 - Monday-Thursday nights:
 \$165 minimum for up to 15 occupants
 \$11 per person/day > 15
 - Friday-Sunday nights:
 - \$270 minimum up to 15 occupants
 - \$18 per person/day > 15

BUS ROUTE PROPOSAL FOR PANORAMIC HIGHWAY

Former Bus Route #63, which ran between Marin City and Stinson Beach via Panoramic Highway, has been part of the Marin County Transit District's 2006 Draft Service Plan going through the approval process. Five public meetings were held in various communities throughout Marin County to receive public comment on revised bus routes for Marin. Under the proposed Service Plan, former Bus Route #63, referred to in the Plan as part of "South Route – Route 61," would be reinstated for service on the weekends. As a result of public input, a later bus was added to leave from Bolinas at 6:39 pm. and arrive at Marin City at 7:42 pm.. The first hearing of the new Service Plan was held by the Marin Board of Supervisors on May 9th. As of press time for this newsletter, a second hearing for approval was scheduled to be before the Board on May 16th. NEW BUS SCHEDULE EFFECTIVE JULY 1ST

The Marin County Transit District (MCTD) has announced the release of new West Marin Stagecoach schedules effective July 1, 2006. The bus route from Bolinas - Marin City and Marin City - Bolinas on the weekends via Panoramic Highway is Bus Route 61W.

Service change highlights include: The North Route 68 runs Monday – Saturday between Inverness, Pt Reyes Station, San Anselmo and San Rafael. South Route runs between Bolinas, Stinson Beach and Marin City according to the following three unique schedules and routes:

-61 on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday - via Shoreline Highway / Highway 1 -61e on Wednesday and Friday - via Shoreline Highway / Highway 1 with extension to Pt. Reyes Station -61w on Saturday (year round) and Sunday (March 15 through November 15) - via Panoramic Highway / Pantoll Ranger Station

The Stagecoach service will be operating larger vehicles on all routes, with capacity of up to 34 passengers, 2 wheelchairs and 2-3 bikes on front racks.

A public hearing has been scheduled for July 11, 2006 for the MCTD Board to consider the adoption of a fare increase on the West Marin Stagecoach. If approved, the following new fares would go into effect on August 1, 2006: Full-price fare of \$2.00. Discount fare of \$1.00 for seniors (over 65), disabled passengers and youth (under 18). Children under 6 will continue to ride free and must be accompanied by an adult.

BIRDING/CONSERVATION WEEKEND A SUCCESS

A total of 20 people showed up for this year's Birding/ Conservation session at Echo Summit Lodge on June 8-11. All the proceeds from this event go into the CAC's Conservation Fund, to be donated to organizations that are working specifically with conservation or environmental projects. Attending this session is a chance to have fun in the mountains while supporting the club's interest in environmental issues.

Two full day birding trips took place, led by **Karen and Jerry Wagner**. On Friday at 7:30 AM, the group headed down Highway 50 towards Pollack Pines and turned off at Ice House Canyon. Up the hill, the visitor's center provided the first stop. The ranger stationed there has planted many native flowers and shrubs, making it a great habitat for birds. As we continued up the hill, we encountered a number of habitats that make the birding interesting, including a hillside recovering from a forest fire, a riparian streamside campground, and a large reservoir.



Saturday, the birding group headed down Highway 50 towards Lake Tahoe. We began the walk in the meadow near the east end of Fallen Leaf Lake. From there we headed to the Lake Tahoe Visitor Center across the highway where we birded along Taylor Creek and eventually down to Lake Tahoe. On both mornings, we ate a picnic style breakfast sitting in the woods. This time of year offers many wildflowers in the meadows and colorful birds to spot while we were eating! We had a total of 60 species sighted for the two days.

The hiking group, led by **Cecilia and Paul Matuzzi**, hiked around Echo Lakes on Saturday. They stopped at a lovely stream for lunch. Even at lake level there were patches of snow on the ground. In some spots, the trail was actually a rushing stream with the snow melting above the trail. It was a very peaceful hike with few people on the trails. They ran into a couple of young rangers that were clearing the trail of fallen limbs and trees. They had the most well pressed, nice looking ranger shorts and shirts. Later in the summer, they probably will be a little more wrinkled.

Saturday evening's program was a puppet show by our own member, **Dan Winkleman**, a retired park ranger. He delighted the group (especially our inner children) with his informative and entertaining educational show about safety and awareness while visiting the coastal beach parks.

This July's conservation donation recipients are "PRBO Conservation Science", "Tamalpais Conservation Club", and "Eldorado National Forest Interpretive Association".

"PRBO Conservation Science" provides a wildlife sanctuary focused on sharing nature and educating visitors. "Tamalpais Conservation Club" continues its trail crew activities in cooperation with GGNRA, MMWD, and the Mt. Tam community, maintaining and improving such trail favorites as the Dipsea, Berry, and Kent. The "Eldorado National Forest Interpretive Association" provides information about history, nature and logistics of the Eldorado National Forest.

ALPINE LODGE HOSTING AND HOST TRAINING

The Alpine Lodge Trustees have encouraged Host Training for members who rent the Lodge for private events with the idea that eventually it would become mandatory. Since the training's inception three years ago more than 90 hosts have been trained. The benefits of Host Training can be seen in more efficiently run events and in the condition in which the Lodge is left for the next group following a trained host event. The Trustees feel that Host Training is essential for the continued well being of the Lodge and its members, and effective January 1, 2007 will require Host Training for member rented events at Alpine Lodge.

Host Training is fun, with open discussions, demonstrations, and a chance to meet other members with an interest in hosting. LODGE RV RATES

The Trustees of Alpine and Echo Lodges have set rates for members who want to park at the Lodges, sleep in their RV's, and use Lodge facilities.

At Echo, the rate is \$5/person/night for members who stay in an RV and use the lodge facilities. This is the same as our dorm rates. At Alpine, the rate is \$15/person/night. This is the same as our standard overnight rate. At Alpine, consideration needs to be made for the very limited parking, outside renters, and other CAC events.

Overnight RV parking is treated like any other overnight. Reservations must be made, in advance, with the host of the event or by prearrangement through the rental process. Normal Associate Member fees will apply for non-members.




The Alpine Lodge Trustees would like to eliminate the need for the difficult outside rentals, like weddings.

As a result, they have requested that the Board of Directors increase the Alpine Lodge usage fee by the CAC from \$6,000 to \$18,000 per year.

Significant email discussion among the CAC leadership indicated support to increase the usage fee to \$12,000 to minimize the number of outside weddings. Board gave approval at the October 15, 2006, meeting. With more weekends available for CAC activity scheduling, internal CAC revenue can be generated for the operation and maintenance of the Alpine Lodge. Please consider sponsoring a CAC event at Alpine Lodge.

To provide the additional \$6,000 per year an increase in dues is being studied by the Finance Committee. First indication is that the necessary increase will be \$10 for a regular member. Any dues change will be proposed to the membership in the December/January TRAILS and at the January 21, 2007, quarterly meeting. The Board of Directors will vote on the proposal at the board meeting on February 18, 2007.

TRAILS NOVEMBER 2006

NEW FLOORING AND STOVE AT ECHO LODGE

You will notice some changes the next time you visit Echo Summit Lodge. We installed a new wood stove and hearth in the dining room. A QuadraFire (twin to the great room stove) replaces the old Buck stove. This new stove will be very efficient, easy to use and regulate. The lodge should be toasty warm this winter, use much less wood, and be better for the environment. We will need to come up with some new jobs for the folks at Fall Work Party since one of the major tasks is splitting and storing the winter wood supply!

After months of planning, new flooring has been installed in the dining room, pantry, back entry, and kitchen bathroom. We chose commercial Marmoleum, a true linoleum made of natural ingredients (linseed oil from flax, wood flour, rosins, pigments, and jute) which is also biodegradable, antibacterial and allergen-free. The kitchen floor was also resurfaced, with a commercial-grade vinyl by Armstrong. Installation began on October 9th. There was an unplanned delay due to a surprise snowstorm that closed Hwy 50 during the morning of October 10th. While the snow was only 6-8 inches deep, CalTrans apparently was not ready for winter yet!

Many thanks to **Jerry Wagner** for his guidance in the choice of these products that are in accordance with Board of Health standards and very appropriate for use at Echo Lodge. Thanks also to **Linda Viviane** and **Jim Nixon** for the time they spent keeping the lodge open for the flooring and stove installers.

The new floors will require a change in the regular maintenance procedures by the folks cleaning up at the end of each session at Echo. You will see the following posted in the kitchen, and we request your cooperation to maintain the luster and good looks of these new floors:

Sweep/dust mop, or better still, vacuum to remove surface soil and debris. Using Johnson Wax Stride (or other neutral pH cleaner) mixed in cool water (as per published instructions on the container) and using a clean damp mop, clean the surface when soiled. Avoid (1) use of high pH, aggressive chemical cleaning agents traditionally associated with vinyl floor coverings (i.e., no ammonia or Pinesol, and (2) using too much water.

FWOC CONSERVATION REPORT

Wildfire in the West was the topic of the 74th Annual Convention of the Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs held September 8-10 in Calaveras Big Trees State Park in Calaveras County. The convention was attended by Winchell Wayward, FWOC's immediate past president and myself as the CAC delegate for the past four years. Our presenters for this topic were John Buckley, Central Sierra Environmental Resource Center, Wayne Harrison, Park Ecologist, and Craig Thomas and Warren Alford, Sierra Nevada Forest Protection Campaign.

Fire has been a controversial topic for a few years. For many years the parks and state and federal forests had the policy of suppressing fire. This has lead to a severe build-up of tinder that has resulted in almost unstoppable fires. For the past few years there has been a trend toward allowing forest fires to burn themselves out and setting controlled burns to reduce fires that spread out of control. These are controversial practices at this time.

The member clubs had submitted resolutions on a wide range of actions being taken in the western states that affect conservation issues. One resolution that involves an area near us is the Tejon Ranch in the Tehachapi Mountains south of Bakersfield. This resolution supports the acquisition of 245,000 acres for a state or national park that will preserve a natural and cultural heritage that is being threatened by large-scale development.

Some other resolutions address issues of global warming, hunting on Santa Rosa Island in the Channel Islands National Park and reviving nuclear energy production. There are fifteen resolutions. Anyone interested in reading the resolutions in their entirety can contact me.

Vice-presidents serve the member clubs. Win Hayward oversees the Bay Area member clubs and I have responsibility for the clubs in northeastern California. The FWOC Executive Committee will meet in Portland in March.
