

The trip was an indescribable wilderness experience, starting from Yosemite Valley on September 1st and ending at Whitney Portal on the 22nd. We hiked all except a 55-mile section of the JMT since we took a 5-day break after 67 miles at Mammoth to deal with blisters. This also gave us a few days to recuperate, adjust our food supply, and get clean clothes and showers. Together we hiked a total of 178 miles on the JMT (plus an additional 26 miles for a re-supply cache and 5 miles when we resumed the trip at Florence Lake near Muir Trail Ranch). We ascended a total of 41,900 feet and descended 37,500 feet. The highest elevation, of course, was Mt. Whitney at 14,496 feet, the highest peak in the "lower 48". I can attest that the air is very thin at that elevation. Even without a 30-lb. pack, I was walking very slowly uphill those last 1.9 miles!

We were incredibly lucky to encounter no rain/snow days. We missed 2 inches of snow in the mountains when we went on blister-break, and the day we hiked out at Whitney Portal, clouds and inclement weather moved in. We camped at very high elevations, however, so the nights were extremely cold, always below freezing, but we were equipped to handle the cold nights. We were impacted 2+ days with smoke from a forest fire in King's Canyon National Park, which spoiled the views in the afternoon and made climbing more challenging due to smoke inhalation.

It has been tough in many ways to get "back to civilization". The solitude and beauty of the mountains, lakes, meadows, etc. are beyond belief with your mind pleasantly void of stress or boundaries (long-trail bliss). You also realize how simple life can be when you only have to focus on the basics and putting one foot in front of the other, but you do have to be adaptable and muster physical resources that we don't usually need, ending each day with bone-weary exhaustion and a sense of accomplishment. Just think of the pioneers and early discoverers who made even longer treks without the benefit of well-engineered trails. However, I can tell you I really appreciate the luxury of hot running water and fresh fruit/vegetables now!



It is very difficult to follow up complaints if we do not have specifics. Early in the morning on January 5, 2011 our revered old time CAC member Betty Osborn died at Marin General Hospital in San Rafael. Betty turned 90 last October 28. Her closest friend of 45 years, **Beverly Heywood**, trusted friend and old time CAC member Gail Lindlow, one of 3 devoted caregivers, Sondra and Beverly's niece Terry of Huntington Beach were still with Betty shortly before her passing. Betty had heart problems and at the end increasingly low blood pressure. She was hospitalized 4 times since last August, but she never lost the sparkle in her eyes. She expressed it through dedicated and joyful service in earlier years as hike and tour leader in the Sierra Club and later with even more fervor in the California Alpine Club at the Alpine Lodge and Echo Summit Lodge during summers and winters alike. Both Betty and Beverly met in the Sierra Club, while hiking. Betty organized many group trips near and far. Friendships extending over decades with Betty have started on hiking trails and backpack trips, like with Mary Jane McKown and Allen Wofchuck, just to mention a few. Betty organized all the meals for extended trips to Chile, Nepal and other places. Member Elsa Weissenberg remembers with fondness the memorable helicopter trip in Canada. Beverly and Betty ventured out on their own to Europe, picked up a brand new VW Bus in Wolfsburg/ Germany, travelling through Germany, Southern France and Spain. Beverly had to return to San Francisco to her job, and Betty continued her travels and later had the VW shipped back to California.

A tireless bundle of energy, she had "a ready smile for everyone", as member Tony Smith e-mailed recently. Betty was true

#### DRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

March and spring arrives. Spring in a way of speaking has arrived in the way the financial and legal activities are being handled. These changes began when **John Hannum** was president. He made us aware that we needed to be more uniform and systematic in the way we conducted the business aspects of CAC. First came a bylaws change requiring the amount of money CAC provides each lodge from the annual dues collection be based on what the predicted needs of each lodge are. That means that records of the costs of operating the lodges need to be analyzed and budgets for anticipated expenses need to be determined.

Although the Finance Committee has always been a component of the governing structure of the Club, it now has taken on more importance and expansion. Each Lodge was asked to have a representative. Many hours have gone into determining recommendations about the dues amount for each year. The Board leans heavily on the recommendation of the Finance Committee to determine the annual dues assessment.

At the Board meeting in January the Board passed four recommendations of the Finance Committee. First was a formula for determining how much to supplement the Alpine Lodge for the many activities that CAC holds there.

A method of recordkeeping for our Donation Refreshment Bar at Alpine Lodge, which is a big part of every CAC dinner, was accepted.

For the Finance Committee to make accurate recommendations to the Board, the Lodges need to provide reports that include all pertinent aspects of the income and expenses to the Finance Committee. The required information was determined for what, how and when these reports are to be made.

And finally complying with the bylaws, the Finance Committee determined that it would conduct a two year review of the treasuries and financial records of the Lodges and CAC.

I described this in just several hundred words, but it represents the hundreds of emails, many meetings and several conference calls to bring this to an agreed upon plan for the future financial method of running the CAC.

The Board recognizes the enormous amount of work, negotiations and determination it took to finalize these recommendations. Just as I am giving a sigh of relief, as if the job is successfully completed, CAC Treasurer **Dennis Ziebell** reminds me that this is a work in progress and will continue to be implemented during the fiscal year.

The CAC Board sincerely thanks Finance Committee Chairperson Carroll Pearson, CAC Treasurer Dennis Ziebell, Echo Lodge Representative Cindy Toran, Alpine



# WHAT DO YOU MEAN THE DECK IS SAGGING?

What do you mean the deck is sagging  $\dots$  this was my rather in ane question to Tony Smith's statement when he called me early in the evening on Wednesday the 6<sup>th</sup> of April.

Tony was staying at the Lodge overnight to get ready for our first Thursday of the Month Work-day. After repeating my question three times, and getting the same answer from Tony, it was finally clear to me that indeed we had a problem with our much loved deck. When I met with Tony later that evening we discovered five concrete piers that hold the vertical beams supporting the deck had dropped three inches and were tilting downhill. The combination of the two actions had caused the middle of the deck at the outside edge (furthest from the building) to sag as much as five inches. At that time, we presumed that the earth movement had been caused by the unusually wet winter.

Unfortunately, we( AL trustees) did not release informed and accurate information about the damage to the deck fast enough to the Board and CAC officers which resulted in exaggerated rumors and unnecessary panic about the safety of not only the deck but of all of our buildings. These rumors were soon put to rest by our civil engineer Jay Hallberg and Vincent Howes, a Geotechnical Engineer whom we hired.

Repair work on the deck foundation started on May 2nd. Jay Hallberg's plans to repair and strengthen the foundation of the deck are as follows:

- 1. Adding new piers next to the existing piers. The existing piers went ten feet in to the ground; the new piers will go 18 to 20 feet in to the ground, hitting bedrock at eleven feet.
- 2. Install 6 tie-backs drilled at a 20 degree angle in to the hillside under the deck .These will be anchored in to rock and supply horizontal stability.
- 3. A grid of reinforced concrete beams tying the new piers, the old piers and the tie-backs together giving the piers horizontal as well as vertical stability.

The next phase of this work will entail repairing the deck and redirecting rainwater drainage.

As the problem of the deck gets under control, we have also engaged Vincent Howes to provide us with a report for a timeline and solutions for the earth movement that has occurred on the lower part of our property leading down to Edgewood Ave.

We hope that you will be reading the June issue of Trails while enjoying our new deck.



On a beautiful day, at the Mexico/California border, CAC member Lynn Zacherson, aka Free Range Amelia, set off to hike the Pacific Crest Trail, to Canada!!! Following are quotes from Lynn's first

"... If you have one of my paintings, you know the beauty I find in people and the natural world. If you run the hills of Wilder Ranch, swim the buoys at Cowells beach, or ride bikes with me you know my joy. If we've worked together, you know the spark I bring to getting the job done.

What you may not know is that I have a passion for the Wilderness. Color, light, and form surround me there as if in a painting. Like John Muir and others, I find my spirit at home in the woods.



This summer I completed a 152-mile solo hike on the Pacific Crest Trail (PCT) from Yosemite to Lake Tahoe. The PCT spans 2,650 miles from Mexico to Canada through California, Oregon and Washington. This year, about 120 men and women finished the PCT. I was honored to meet two of the women, one 18 years old and one 65. They are my inspiration. Over 1,000 people climb Mt. Everest each year, quite a few more than the handful that will complete a thru hike of the PCT in 2011.

My goal is to complete the entire 2,650 mile trail in five months, May through September 2011. By completing the hike I will inspire others to dream of what is possible without limits of gender or age.

As Amelia Earhart said, "The most difficult thing is the decision to act, the rest is merely tenacity"...

You are all welcome to join me on the trail. I hope you will come with me and dream!"





### **ALPINE GARDEN**

For CAC Members and visitors to 730 Panoramic Highway there are two spectacular panoramic views: first to the West, the hills and vales all the way to the Pacific Ocean. Turning to the East and looking down over the slope behind Alpine Lodge, our eyes wash over a scene that an impressionist painter would have loved. Lavender cosmos from the seeds saved by **Donna Rice** and a lush field of blue forget-me-knots. Everybody loves the white daisy bush and naked ladies, plants of course, donated by **Renee Powers**. A rock wall runs along the path to the Tam Building put there by the many hours of the hard labor of **Bill Pung, Dennis Ziebell** and **Jamie Watson** who helped with the initial preparation. Bucolic, yes, an overused word, but absolutely the most perfect word to describe this view.

About three years ago the Alpine Lodge Garden Committee was formed including members **Ruth Tretbar**, **Don** and **Donna Rice**, **Dennis Ziebell** and **Bill Pung**. Although the aesthetic values of the garden were important aspects, equally important were the functional purposes it was planned to fulfill.

A butterfly garden of lavender, butterfly bush, yarrow, purple salvia, and trailing purple lantana was begun to provide habitat for the endangered Mission Blue Butterfly.

On the downhill side of the path, lantana bushes mark the entrance to the Tam Building and native grasses were planted to protect the slope from erosion.

The CAC Board had voted to promote conservation values in the way the lodge was used and cared for. A composting system was established and has been maintained to recycle the left over vegetable scraps from food preparation which results, after a period of time, to provide rich mulch to enhance the soil.

The garden is alive and fragile. It has suffered several disruptive events. First new gas and water pipes needed to be laid from the front of the property to the Tam Building causing many plants to be destroyed and soil to become unstable. The new wall was put in to support the hillside where soil had become unstable and was creeping onto the pathway. Salvaged and new plants again covered the diggings over the new pipes. Normalcy was returning, when the slope became unstable,

resulting in the deck slumping. Many plants succumbed to the traffic as a result the deck repair work. The deck has now been finished and the area looks better than ever with new woodchips and yellow and blue Lupines planted on the hillside above the stone wall.

Everyone who has ever gardened knows that the work in a garden is always an ongoing project. The Garden Committee, aided by volunteers who have donated plants and hundreds of hours of labor, continue to make plans and accommodate unexpected happening to the garden. Ed Del Monte, Eddie Nelson and Ann Meneguzzi have donated many plants. Bill Pung has dug many holes to establish them in our garden. More plants are needed to help hold the steep and shifting slope in place. The Garden Committee can benefit from your contributions of plants, labor and cash and becoming a member of the Garden Committee. Please contact one of them to let them know how you can help or just join in at a work party when there is always garden maintenance work to do.

Our beloved Donna has passed away, but every year her beautiful cosmos will grace the Alpine Lodge gardens in her memory.



# President's Message

Jambo,

Jan and I just returned from a wildlife safari in several National Parks of Tanzania. Did you know there are more than 130 different tribes living there? Neither did we. Unfortunately we met very few humans but lots of exotic animals. We saw antelope,




Cape buffalo, elephants, giraffe, rhinos, hippos, crocodiles, lions, leopards, cheetahs, wildebeests, baboons, hyenas, zebras, monkeys and more. While some were off in the distance, the majority were within a few feet of our truck.

Bird lovers would have a field day in these parks. Ostrich sprinted about with the elephants and zebras. Pink flamingos swooped over Lake Manyara. Winged creatures of every iridescent hue flew all around us, from the tiniest hummingbird to the flying Great Bustard (45 pounds).

I try to visualize geography in America to compare with what we experienced in the parks. The plains states might fit part of the picture but you would need to throw in four or five volcanoes, many mountains (not as tall as the Sierra's), a 10-mile long by 11-mile wide volcanic crater (Ngorongoro) and a 3,700 mile long crack in the earth (Great Rift Valley)

We were fortunate to become acquainted with some Tanzanians from the Maasai tribes. They are mostly nomadic and live on meat and milk from their cattle. Their temporary shelters are made of small trees, cow dung, urine and ash. We visited a village kindergarten and learned that the older kids walk 4 hours round trip to school. We were impressed with how hardy and self-reliant they are. They don't own



### MAZAMAS, AND THE FEDERATION OF **WESTERN OUTDOOR CLUBS**

Mazamas, founded in 1894 on the summit of Mt. Hood, is a nonprofit mountaineering education organization located in Portland, Oregon. In 1931, the Mazamas invited about 20 mountain climbing and recreation clubs in the West to come to the dedication of their lodge and bring a stone from their home area for the new fireplace as a symbol of common interest and collaboration among the groups.

California Alpine Club provided a stone. This meeting led to the formation of the Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs the following year of which the California Alpine Club is a founding member.
