DUES INCREASE

The Board of Director's, at the November 19 meeting, voted to increase yearly membership dues. This was done following the recommendation of our Finance committee. What this means to you is: if you currently pay \$60.00 your dues will increase to \$65.00, \$90.00 to \$100.00, \$100.00 to \$110.00 and \$155.00 to \$170.00. This is the first increase in dues in five years and is between *two and three cents per day, per member.* If the increase results in a 5% loss in membership, the change would produce a modest boost to the CAC reserves of about \$1,500 per year. On the other hand, if memberships are not terminated the increase could be \$4,195. Please do not terminate your membership over two or three cents a day.

The reason for the increase is the Club does not currently have adequate reserves to cover planned for work at both lodges, plus unexpected expenses. In the recent past there were situations where the total reserves (CAC, Alpine, and Echo) were inadequate to meet unexpected expenses. Measures to cover the extraordinary expense included; transfer of funds from CAC reserves, loans from each of the lodges, member donations, and an assessment. Our by-laws prohibit the Club from incurring indebtedness.

The club continues measures to limit its expenses. However some are fixed and cannot be avoided and continue to increase, (taxes, insurance, etc.) For instance, publishing and mailing costs alone represent 20% of the CAC budget. With mailing rates scheduled to increase, it is more important for you to consider receiving your Trails via the Internet instead of the snail mail. Finally, I trust that you consider everything the club has meant to you over the years and optimistically for years to come and that you remain with the club into our 100th year. I have and I am.

CANYONLANDS, UTAH CANOE TRIP

A hardy group of thirteen adventurers paddled six canoes and one kayak down the Colorado River through the Canyonlands National Park from Moab, Utah. Our fearless leaders were **Bob Hanson** and **Carlos Miranda**. We paddled on the river for five days, setting up camp and cooking two meals most days, with Bob and Carlos as the anchor chefs and volunteers assisting on meal preparation and washing up. The local, tasty Green River melons were on the menu.

We hiked and explored some canyons along the way, including Monument Canyon. On display were the buttes, mesas, plateaus and pinnacles in brilliant reds, greens, dark browns and blacks (from minerals) eroded by storm run-off from raised portions of the earth's crust. The "angle of repose" is where loosened rocks, some the size of a house, move downslope due to gravity and accumulate at the bottom of cliffs. The landscape is a geologist's playground, as eons show in the colorful layers.

We enjoyed five days on the river, three of which were sunny and two of which brought cold, wind, rain and hail. **Jim Hatfield** took an unplanned swim in cold water due to sudden, unanticipated movement, but no canoes capsized, fortunately. Our gear was protected from the elements by dry bags; only one tent failed in the storm and collapsed under rain water.

We tracked some mammals and birds who left their prints in the mud, observed lizards and blue herons, and even heard the fish jumping. **Arnold Champagne** regaled us with tall tales in the afternoon and evening as we gathered around the campfire. 
During the summer of 1919 the club made its first excursion into the High Sierra, a very successful under-taking, spending two weeks in the Kern River Canyon area. All but 5 of the 37 members signed the Club Register on the summit of Mt. Whitney.

The enthusiasm of those participating caused the Board of Directors to submit an amendment to the By-Laws creating an ANNUAL OUTINGS COMMITTEE. In July 1920, to Kings Canyon, the Committee was responsible for engaging the pack train, employing the chef and assistants, purchasing and shipping all supplies and equipment. The outings to be run at cost, making it possible for many to travel in the "big country" with much greater comfort and convenience than on individual excursions.

ECHO SUMMIT LODGE BIRDING FORAY & CONSERVATION BENEFIT

It's time to sign up for this year's Birding Foray & Conservation Benefit event held this coming June 6-11 (Wed-Mon).

Four birding trips will be led by **Karen & Jerry Wagner**. We visit varied habitats in hopes of finding many unique species. Birders from beginning to expert are welcome. We leave the lodge at 7:30 am after coffee, snack & lunch making. Picnic breakfast and lunch in the field.

Thursday, we head to Markleyville and the Nevada side of the Sierras. Friday the group will head down Highway 50 towards Pollack Pines and take the turn off at Ice House Canyon. Saturday, we head down Highway 50 towards Lake Tahoe. We began the walk in the meadow near the east end of Fallen Leaf Lake. From there we head to the Lake Tahoe Visitor's Center where we bird along Taylor Creek and eventually down to lake. In early June, there will the first wildflowers in the meadows and colorful breeding birds in the trees. 60 bird species have been sighted in past years.

2012 FOUNDATION GRANT WILL SUPPORT MT. TAM STATE PARK

A much-needed project at Pantoll campground will be funded by the CAC Foundation this year. 
Charles and Peter, (photo attached) worked in the social hall prepping and painting window frames. and contributed their companionship around the lunch table.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO BUILD RETAINING WALL AT ECHO

As you may have noticed, the propane tank has been temporarily moved from its original position to an area that is actually parking at Echo Lodge. The reason? The hillside the propane tank was on started slowly crumbling away. A runaway propane tank holding 5000 gallons of gas would not have been a good thing!

We trustees have decided that a block retaining wall will be needed to stop the erosion of the hillside, and the eventual loss of our parking area. **Jerry Wagner**, a member of CAC and a retired architect, volunteered to help. He contacted an engineer who gave us the specs needed, and he drew up plans, all of which went to the local USFS office for approval. With a letter of approval from the USFS, and plans and specs, we will be able to get a permit from El Dorado County for the work that needs to be done. We hope to finish the wall, and the other work that needs to be done, this summer/fall. Don't want to be out there in November or December with the wind howling and the snow blowing!

The club's highest honor, the Distinguished Service Award, was given to him in April of 2002 at the Annual Awards Banquet. He richly deserved it. He led many canoe trips on the Russian River. He was active with the folk and square dance groups that used to dance on a regular basis in our social hall. He played the piano and lead singing, especially at Christmas time. Always he attended and participated in the board and membership meetings. CAC is a member of the Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs and Win was very active in the Federation and coordinated one of its annual conventions at our Echo Lodge. Now after his death we have learned that he continued his dedication to CAC by leaving a very generous monetary gift. All of you who knew him will remember him for the passion with which he lived his life and all of the activities in which he engaged himself.

TRUCKEE WINTER SPORTS TRIP FEBRUARY 2, 1916

Twenty-eight Alpine Club members met at 6:00 PM to take the Ferry to Oakland to catch the Southern Pacific train overnight that parked on the tracks at Truckee. Next morning most were awakened by snowballs thrown by the few who had already been out in the snow. For many it was the first time they had seen snow. The first day mostly spent sightseeing in Truckee, tobogganing, sledding, and trying to get around on the awkward skiis. Monday 20 started, only twelve of them made the three-mile trip to frozen Donner Lake and tried climbing up a short distance skiing down the hills that rise around the lake.



Tuesday they set forth again, this time with a Swiss instructor who taught them how to scale the steep slopes and enjoy the trip down without taking off the skiis. Late afternoon they all went to Truckee, in the evening attending a dance. At midnight they regretfully said goodbye, back on the train and started for San Francisco.

ECHO LODGE FALL WORK PARTY 2012

Miracle of miracle, the weather was wonderful for the entire 2012 fall work party. This was a good thing, considering all the outside work that we'd planned on accomplishing. The work party actually started in August, at the trailclearing weekend, when workers began the demolition of the crumbling wall, and the two gigantic tree stumps, which were the basic cause of the crumbling. We rented a backhoe for this work, and Tim Seeley and Bob Henry were the backhoe maestros, hacking away at the hillside, and the mounds of dirt and rocks that needed to be transported down the hillside. Helping Tim and Bob were Tom Coleman, the inimitable Mary Larkin, Rod Bauer, Jay and Mary Gustafson, Jon Erickson and Teena Murch. Jay hurt his hand trying to wrestle the backhoe, and lost that match, so he got to supervise! We were able to prepare the area for the new block wall, tamp down 20 yards of 'baserock', and actually lay the first layer of 90 lb. blocks.

Tim Seeley and his friend Rosa came up later that month, and laid the French drain pipe and the barrier cloth over it.

We had rented the backhoe for a month, so it was still available to us during the FWP. It came in very handy, and thankfully, we had two men who knew how to run it. **Gary Pride** and **Terry Goddard**, who aren't even members yet, get our gratitude for pouring all 30 yards of backfill rock behind our block wall as it rose up from it's base. Helping with the wall were **Kurt Eichstaedt**, Mary Larkin (there she is again!), **Bob Burkle**, **Ken Patera**, **Joe Fay** and **Becky Sandman**, **Mark Sapiro**, and many others. The new block retaining wall is almost completed. When it's done, we'll have the county inspector come out, check our work, and sign off on the project. Tom Coleman is planning on going up in early November to build a concrete pad for the propane tank, and have the tank moved back to it's original spot, with no more concerns of whether it will fall down that crumbling



hillside. Tom estimated that Echo Lodge saved \$10,000.00 or more by doing this very challenging job with California Alpine Club volunteer members and those who may become members. The trustees of Echo Lodge would like to thank all the folks who gave of their time and energy to make this happen!

Much more work was accomplished at Echo, of course! Cook Tree Service cut down a 100 foot-tall dead tree. It gets this winter to 'cure', and then we'll put **Bob Henry** and **Mary Larkin**, our king and queen of log rounding, on chain sawing it down to splitting size! Should get 4 or 5 cord out of it! Rounds already cut and cured were split and taken to the basement storage area. Echo now has 10 cords of fresh dry wood, ready to keep the chill out this coming ferocious (we hope!) winter. Helping with this work were **Shirlee Stiles, Paula Dueweke, Mark Sapiro, Gary Pride** and **Masami Takesue**.
