MEMBERSHIP APPROVES CHANGES TO BY-LAWS

The following changes to our by-laws were approved by the membership at our Annual Meeting on April 26. Under Article III (Section 1) Officers, the term for Board members has been increased from one to two years; (Section 7) Duties of the Treasurer, the requirement for two signatures for checks of \$500.00 or more was eliminated. In (Section 8) Duties of the Registrar, the language was removed requiring the Registrar to collect and submit entrance fees to the Treasurer. Finally in Article IV (Section 1) Meetings of the Club, the language was changed to allow more flexibility in scheduling meetings where there are conflicts with holidays or other events. The updated version of the by-laws will appear on our new website. These changes were made to allow smother operation of the club and/or to reflect current practices. The existing by-laws can be view on our current website.
