### Different Hikes for Different Types: Our Weekly Tradition for Sunday Hiking

The 2B hikes depart from the Alpine Club at 9:30 am. These hikes are 7–10 miles long and up to 2,000 feet elevation gain. On days shown as leaderless, the hikers will decide on their own route after convening at the Alpine Club.

Informal, slower-paced 1A hikes depart from the Alpine Club at 9:45 am. These hikes are 5–6 miles and up to 1,000 feet elevation gain.

If you are interested in leading a 2B hike shown as open, please email Pauline MacDonald. For information on the 1A hikes call Edie or Mayme.

We suggest bringing a sandwich (or something) for a trailside lunch and a liter of water. All hikers should have prior hiking experience and be able to hike at a moderate pace (i.e., approx. 2 miles per hour). The hikes usually finish at the Alpine Club around 2:00–2:30 pm.

Note: If you hike in front of the leader and are not at the stated destination when the leader arrives, the leader will consider you are no longer on the hike.

### NO MORE KEYS AT ALPINE LODGE

About a year ago I joined the Board of Trustees for the Alpine lodge. It's been a busy year and there are many lodge improvement projects underway. One opportunity was to account for the large number of Alpine keys around without a way to track them. Although there may not be a specific security problem yet, the trustees sought a reasonable way to manage access while best serving club needs. Most of you don't know that I am a technology person. I run X2nSat, a Satellite Network Communications company. It sounds fancy, but my job is mostly creative. So I did some research to see what problems or concerns members have. For example:

"I hate when I drive all the way up [to the lodge] and have forgotten my key", "I don't do spontaneous rentals or stay-overs because it's too hard to get a key", "I lost my key long ago...", "I don't know if I can have a key" (as in allowed to have one), "What is the policy on who gets a key?", "When I rent the lodge for a special event it would be nice to give a key to the caterer or cleaners in case they are there when I am not..."

With this in mind, I went to work on a solution. There are three doors between the two buildings that you need a key to access. In June, the Alpine Trustees found electronic locks to be the most flexible and thorough for Alpine Lodge use. These locks look like regular door handles, except they have a numeric keypad. You type in the code and the door unlocks. The best part is we can have thousands of codes and the codes can be made to work for a specific duration of time, such as a weekend for a rental to provide all your guests. And, we won't ever have to re-key the locks again! We can just create codes instantly and as needed.

Imagine this.... Something comes up and someone needs a code to get in the building. A quick phone call to a trustee and they can give you a code over the phone. We can:

Create long term codes for each person that needs one, Create temporary codes for repair, renters or vendors, Provide codes for the duration of any stay, Issue new codes quickly.

The policy for the codes:

Codes are issued by request (we won't issue one to every member as many don't want or need one)

Codes will be made to last until the end of the current calendar year, so you need a new code come January of each year. This also matches our membership dues schedule. You will need to be paid up on your dues in order to get a code

Members are asked not to share their code. If you forget your code, we can remind you what it is. If someone needs a new code, just call, email, or text a trustee and we will get you one.

Locks will be installed October 15. CAC Board members, Events Committee members and trained hosts will receive a code to use. If any CAC member has questions about getting a code, please contact the accommodations coordinator Donata Mikulik at donatabo@hotmail.com.

### **MONEY WELL SPENT**

One of eight grants from the CAC Foundation this year went to the Center for Sierra Nevada Conservation, based near Tahoe. This organization has been implementing restoration projects on the Eldorado National Forest. They have a full-time two-person restoration team, and a corps of about 30 volunteers that assist with larger projects. Last year CSNC restored 150 illegal roads and single-track dirt bike trails totaling 22 acres. These projects helped to protect streams and riparian areas, as well as sensitive plant habitat and archaeological sites.

This is typical of the projects the Foundation supports. Funding comes from members' generous donations which are tax-deductible.
