

#### Different Hikes for Different Types: Our Weekly Tradition for Sunday Hiking

The 2B hikes depart from the Alpine Lodge at 9:30am. These hikes are 7-10 miles long and up to 2,000 feet elevation gain. On days shown as leaderless, the hikers will decide on their own route after convening at the lodge.

Informal, slower paced 1A hikes depart from the Alpine Lodge at 9:45am. These hikes are 5-6 miles and up to 1,000 feet elevation gain.

If you are interested in leading a 2B hike shown as open, please e-mail Pauline MacDonald. For information on the 1A hikes call Edie Nelson.

We suggest bringing a sandwich (or something) for a trailside lunch and a liter of water. All hikers should have prior hiking experience and be able to hike at a moderate pace (i.e., approx. 2 miles per hour). The hikes usually finish at the Alpine Lodge around 2:00-2:30pm.

Note: If you hike in front of the leader and are not at the stated destination when the leader arrives, the leader will consider you are no longer on the hike.

# NEW WEATHER STATION ON MT. TAM FUNDED BY CAC FOUNDATION

Will it rain? Is it too hot to hike? It's hard to know what the weather will be on Mt. Tam if your weather app only gives you information on Mill Valley. With this in mind, the California Alpine Club Foundation has awarded a grant to the West Point Inn to purchase and install a weather station that monitors temperature, wind direction and speed, atmospheric pressure, humidity, and rainfall. The 100-year-old inn sits on the southern slope of the mountain about two miles from Alpine Lodge. The weather station data is sent to a computer onsite and then uploaded to the internet, allowing people to track weather at West Point Inn from anywhere in the world!

Besides seeing the data from West Point Inn, the weather-curious can compare the readings with other nearby weather stations to see how temperatures vary from one part of the mountain to another.

#### CAC'S SEPTEMBER SUCCESS AT FWOC

The November TRAILS reported about four CAC members' September trip to Bainbridge Island for the 2016 Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs Conference. At that gathering, a resolution submitted by the CAC and another club was unanimously adopted by the FWOC voting delegates. Even though the resolution concerned events in California, delegates from clubs in other states recognized that public parks in all states which have concession operations may be vulnerable to the same kind of historic name hijacking that took place in Yosemite National Park earlier this year. CAC's **Ann Meneguzzi** was the primary author of this successful resolution.

On 9/21/2016 Gov. Brown signed AB2249, the Park Heritage Protection legislation that this resolution supported.

### Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs Resolution 2016-3 Park Heritage Protection

Submitted by California Alpine Club and California State Park Rangers Association

#### <u>Background</u>

In early 2016, a well-publicized contract dispute over usage rights to historic place names in Yosemite National Park outraged that park's visitors and fans when it led to the renaming of popular venues. Delaware North, the departing concessionaire, claimed ownership of the original names of various lodgings and retail service sites even though those facility names predated that concessionaire's 23 year presence in Yosemite NP. During its 23 years as the NPS contracted concessionaire in Yosemite, Delaware North operated various lodging and business facilities such as the Ahwahnee Hotel, Yosemite Lodge, Curry Village, and Badger Pass Ski Area.

These famous names predate Delaware North's presence as the concessionaire for visitor facilities in Yosemite. Often there has been an

historic significance to the existing and well-known names. Unknown to the NPS, Delaware North trademarked the historic names at some time during its tenure as concessionaire. When Delaware North lost the facilities operating contract to another company, it claimed to "own" the customary names and demanded to be paid \$51 million to transfer the trademark rights to the popular historical names. The NPS is seeking to have Delaware North's trademarking of the pre-existing Yosemite facility names declared void.

While this contract dispute continues to be fought in court, new signs with unfamiliar names have replaced the ones park visitors have known and used since establishment. Park visitors are confused and angered by the loss of what was there before. The popular view is that these iconic park names were hijacked and that the trademark claim is a violation of the public trust. People believe that Yosemite is a national treasure and the facilities there belong collectively to the people of the United States.

This contract dispute over Yosemite facility names has drawn attention to the importance of protecting familiar park names from being claimed by businesses contracted to provide services in parks.

#### Resolution

The Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs supports California Heritage Protection legislation and other measures that prohibit state park concession, contractor and others from the ability for a concessionaire or contractor to claim a trademark, copyright or other ownership interest in any name associated with a state park unit or feature.

<u>Further Resolved</u>: The FWOC Executive Committee is authorized to support in the name of FWOC other similar legislation, state, federal or local, that protects the iconic names associated with national, state or local parks and other protected natural and cultural sites from concession and other business entities being able to copyright or trademark these names to the exclusion of the agency owning, managing or operating these protected areas.
