Hello Everyone,

HELP!

This will be a short message.

Currently the Board and the Alpine Trustee's each have one open position. The Board has 10 of the possible 11 members. A quorum



of six is required to conduct meetings. Currently one member is on maternity leave and another's' health makes attending meetings nearly impossible. Add in everyday life events and obtaining a quorum at times becomes difficult. I am telling you this to ask you to please consider volunteering to be on the Board, either in the short term or the longer term. I signed on for a one-year stint and am now in the fourth year. For some, serving as Board Member, Trustee, Committee Member, or all of those of you who do not get your names mentioned often enough, doing this kind of service makes you feel good. For more information or to volunteer, please contact any Board Member or me.

The Alpine Trustees with only four of the five positions filled are in a similar situation in assigning duties. So I ask you to please consider volunteering to be a trustee at Alpine Lodge. If you have any questions contact Jay Gustafson or any of the trustees listed in the box on the left.

In the long term we face a serious situation in which several Alpine trustees might be leaving in May 2015. The box on the left shows when each trustees term ends. That is a little misleading as both Edie Nelson and Russ Toran signed on for one year. Jay Gustafson has indicated the desire to serve on the Board and Dan Larson's term is ending.

Each year the President appoints the Nominating Committee, which I've already done. But if you would like to do your yearly volunteer service on the committee contact me, the committee could always use additional help. This committee finds and recommends to the Board and the membership persons to fill vacant positions. In the case of lodge trustees their three-year terms end on alternating years to allow for experienced trustees to always be on hand. Beginning May 2015 the Board will have two-year terms. 
Host Training October 17th and 18th

On August 15th through the 17th, the California Alpine Club and the Pacific Crest Trail Association held a dual club trail-clearing weekend at Echo Lodge. This is the first time that we have worked together on the PCT since 1996.

Masami Takesue, Gary Pride, Bruce and Diane Friend, and USFS leader Jon Erickson (also a CAC member) and I represented CAC. From the Pacific Crest Trail Association we had the great trail-clearing leader Forrest Kelly, Aaron Girard, Diane and Jerry Schweickert, who generously donated \$100.00 to the cause. Also attending were father-son team Jay and Michael Chamberlain, Heather Rand and friend Joanne Queiroz, and Bill Leonard.

Bruce and Diane kindly volunteered for the weekend's kitchen duty and kept us well fed. As many of you know, they are both chefs, and we were glad to have them.

After a detailed safety meeting, and tool explanation session on Saturday morning, we 'trucked' to the Echo Lake parking lot where we split into two groups of 6. Group 1 took the water-taxi, to the pier at the far end of the lake, hiked to Haypress Meadows, and worked back from there to the pier. Group 2 started at the dam end of Echo Lake and toward the taxi-pier. We spent hours clearing the PCT of loose rock AKA 'ankle-snappers', clearing debris from the back side of water bars, and cleaning out upper and lower ends of culverts. FWOC CONFERENCE AT ECHO LODGE

On a lovely weekend in late August I had the great honor to join fellow Board Member Ann Meneguzzi as representatives of the CAC at the annual Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs (FWOC) conference, held at Echo Lodge. I am embarrassed to say that I didn't know what to expect. It turned out that I was to spend a weekend with many of the great movers and shakers in the environmental movement. To name just two, Joe Fonatine, a former Sierra Club President (1980-1982) was there. Joe and others like him have been fighting for more than 40 years to protect, from logging, forest that by all accounts had been legislatively saved for future generations to enjoy. Michael McCloskey served as Executive Director of the Sierra Club for 16 1/2 years, retiring in 1985. During his tenure, he guided the campaigns to save the Grand Canyon and establish Redwoods National Park and North Cascades National Park. During the 1970s, he led the Club's legislative activity—preserving Alaskan lands and eastern wilderness areas, and supporting the new environmental agenda: the Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976, the Clean Air Act amendments, and the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977, passed during the administration of President Jimmy Carter. I could go on and name all the others and their success stories but that would take pages. These others are factors in the reason you and I, have safe open spaces to enjoy. These exceptional people are working tirelessly, in front and behind the scenes without economic reward, preserving or restoring as many natural areas as possible. But they cannot do it without our support. If you think you would enjoy working on the legislative side of protecting the environment please contact me. I am sure the club would appreciate it. Although we might think so, public spaces are not guaranteed. There are forces constantly chipping away, seeking economic rewards without consideration for future generations.

The event concluded with voting on several resolutions. Some resolutions, like the one asking the governors of Oregon and Washington, legislatures, Congress, Forest Service etc. to adopt legislation regulating transport of coal and crude oil through the Columbia River Gorge and other areas, passed with little opposition. Representatives from neighboring states hotly discussed the resolution Opposing Privatization of Public Lands. All resolutions, after amendments, were eventually passed unanimously. One final resolution thanked the Echo Lodge Trustees for providing the Lodge and specifically thanked Trustee Bob Henry and former Trustee Tom Coleman for all their work in preparing the lodge and meals. I was constantly told that the food at this conference was the best they ever had. I was also told how friendly the atmosphere was. Well, if you know Bob and Tom, how could it be anything else?

I recall the words of a favorite Joni Mitchell song from the 70's which in part says They paved paradise and put up a parking lot, with a pink hotel and a swinging hot spot.... took all the trees put them in a tree museum and charged all the people a dollar and a half to see 'um.... Don't it always seem to go that you don't know what you've got till it's gone....
