

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The club was founded in 1913 and became well known for its weekend hiking activities on Mt Tam, the nearest alpine like hiking venue for San Franciscans during those early days. Not long after, focus expanded to summer adventure in the Sierras, with some challenging events for those days, balanced with some service to "summiteers" who were able to



make it to the top of certain California peaks and leave their names and signatures in CAC "summit record books in steel boxes." Family demands and lodge life shifted a bit to Sierra skiing, and Echo Summit Lodge was added to the choices. CAC's sense of adventure "tamed" a bit, as our hikers moved along the life pathway, while a mixed and matched array of club offerings became more our profile... meeting the desires of multiple constituencies made up of age groups, solo/coupled, family orientations (kids and all the joys of their expression and experience on the mountain), and more.

Today the club continues to serve these multiple interest groups. However, it is becoming more difficult to categorize folks as one or the other as our members often fit many such categories, and are proud of it! But what we have been noticing is more emphasis of hiking and adventure in outings, away from the lodge atmosphere and near-by Mt Tam trail selection.

This trend is healthy for our club, as we are finding that members meet other members and friends with whom they had no previous connection, and very often become fast friends for more than just that day or that weekend's event. Whether we return to the California Alpine 'Matrimonial' Club of years past (circa 1920's and 30's; doubtful, non?) or we morph into a club of like-minded folks willing to take the same or even more risk in the outdoors than we thought possible.

So where are you in this? Are you finding new faces and challenges to meet your dreams; have you proposed ideas to the Outing and hiking folks; and have you thought to build an event which we could execute thru Peak Adventures who offer us deep service thru the admin/permits/logistics/execution of outdoor adventure? Summer is nearing, and we have lots of capacity to fill if you ask. There are at least two rafting trips being suggested on the lower sections of the American, there are Saturday Sorties galore available... and Sunday at Alpine and on Tam is always there for ya.

For years we have not done much to celebrate Memorial Day on the mountain. This year your leadership is planning a very special Mt Tam adventure for you, SO PLEASE "SAVE THE DATE" – Monday MAY $28^{\rm TH}\ldots$ and watch Trails for the announcement. There isn't a member who wouldn't want to be on the mountain that day, given the plans for adventure and contribution … STAY TUNED …

Different Hikes for Different Types: Our Weekly Tradition for Sunday Hiking Rain Cancels All Hikes!

Our 2B hikes depart from the California Alpine Club at 9:30 a.m. These hikes are 7-10 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 2,000 ft. When there is no leader specified for a given Sunday, the convened hikers at the CAC will decide upon their own route.

A more informal, slower paced hike – designated as 1A – will depart from the CAC at 9:45 a.m. These hikes are typically 5-6 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 1,000 ft.

Please remember to bring a light lunch and at least a liter of water. All hikers should have prior hiking experience and be able to maintain a moderate pace (i.e., approximately two miles per hour). The hikes usually finish at the CAC around 2:00-3:00 p.m.

Note: Hike group safety protocols prevail. If you want to hike in front of the leader, please inform the leader. If given permission, you must stop at any intersection or junction and wait for the group. You must also be within earshot in case the group is held up. If you do not follow these steps, we will no longer consider you part of the group.
