PROGRESS ON NEW SECTION OF TRAIL AT ECHO SUMMIT

In late September Echo Summit Lodge was again the center of a trail-clearing weekend with about 25 individuals pitching in. Under the supervision of the Forest Service, members of the CAC, the Tahoe Rim Trail Association, and the Pacific Crest Trail Association formed three teams that went out to make trail improvements.

One group cut back the perennial brushy overgrowth from Lower Echo Lake to Johnson Pass Road. Another team did some grading and built steps on the South Side of Highway 50 where the trail parallels the road. The third group began working on the long desired re-route of the Pacific Crest Trail/Tahoe Rim Trail moving it away from Highway 50 (to the South) and from Adventure Mountain (to the West).



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This edition of TRAILS covers the busy months of December AND January, which makes this column not so current. What I can report on is the energy of things I am privy to from members, how there are pockets of energy and action going on which serves us all but -- not widely known in this 105 year old hiking club.



Let me be remedial for

a minute here. Our club is made of members who love the outdoors, express that in contribution and give-back, and spend healthy parts of their time on the mountain or out and away from the day-by-day "civilized" parts. Many see the lodges as a focus of continued contribution and as points of gathering and celebrating, and thus the places which require the most volunteer effort. But the club is more than its lodges, just ask those who've returned from a day hike or a three day weekend on some exotic "Outings" venture.

So the remedial point here is that for each us, there is a responsibility to give back to the club... and that expression may be through means which do not involve the lodges, though lodge Trustees encourage all members, who can, to join work parties during the year.

So what are these "other means?' and how do we affect such "give-back?"

Here's the genius in all this - it's a "bottom-up" program club. Leadership is not engaged in creating something new for the club; its responsibility is to encourage and assist members who choose to make the effort for something. We are a member-driven-club. You are the fire-makers.

So Renee Hamilton and Ernie Castieux chose to do just that by initiating outings activities "themselves" and then chose to incorporate that energy into more activities which formed and became the "Outings Committee," a group which had been languishing for some time. Renee and Ernie focused on the weekend potential and created the "Saturday Sorties" which offers day adventure. Mary Larkin-Berlinski upped her input with more offerings as she saw others would assist in the admin/organization of longer trips to places beyond the weekenders. This story is just getting started, or re-started.

The inference is clear: the club exists for its members and leadership is mandated to encourage members to express, offer and participate in matters of adventure and contribution. The club has an expectation of a once annual contribution from each member as a volunteer; this has been part of the membership pledge and renewal process for years. But many think it's a request to come to the lodge and do laboring tasks, to keep the place going ... this is a narrow view of service, but very prevalent.

As "busy lives" is the deferral-de jour for most of us, and the realization that I (we) may not be able to manage the heavy lifting assumed for Lodge maintenance, many members simply remain "unavailable." To examine that

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

The Board, at its *July 21, meeting,* approved consideration of changing our by-laws to allow **up to** seven trustees at each lodge. Current language requires five trustees. *Trustee chairs* at Alpine and Echo Lodge (**Tom Coleman and Cindy Toran**) support the language change.

Here is the current language:

Article VI - Lodge Trustees Section 1 - Number of Trustees

There shall be five Trustees to manage Alpine Lodge and five Trustees to manage Echo Summit Lodge. Should the Club acquire any other lodges, five Trustees shall manage each.

Proposed language:

Article VI - Lodge Trustees Section 1 - Number of Trustees
There shall be a minimum of five Trustees and a maximum of seven
Trustees to manage Alpine Lodge and a minimum of five Trustees and a
maximum of seven Trustees to manage Echo Summit Lodge. Should the Club
acquire any other lodges the same minimum and maximums annly. Trustees

acquire any other lodges, *the same minimum and maximums apply*. Trustees shall manage each lodge

The change does not require additional trustees be added.

A vote by a quorum of 30 of our members is required to change our by-laws. **Membership meeting on January 26, 2019**, starts at 1pm and is preceded by lunch for members. Please plan to attend for this important vote.

Different Hikes for Different Types: Our Weekly Tradition for Sunday Hiking Rain Cancels All Hikes!

Our 2B hikes depart from the California Alpine Club at 9:30 a.m. These hikes are 7-10 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 2,000 ft. When there is no leader specified for a given Sunday, the convened hikers at the CAC will decide upon their own route.

A more informal, slower paced hike – designated as 1A – will depart from the CAC at 9:45 a.m. These hikes are typically 5-6 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 1,000 ft.

Please remember to bring a light lunch and at least a liter of water. All hikers should have prior hiking experience and be able to maintain a moderate pace (i.e., approximately two miles per hour). The hikes usually finish at the CAC around 2:00-3:00 p.m.

Note: Hike group safety protocols prevail. If you want to hike in front of the leader, please inform the leader. If given permission, you must stop at any intersection or junction and wait for the group. You must also be within earshot in case the group is held up. If you do not follow these steps, we will no longer consider you part of the group.

A few Alpine Lodge reminders; direct any questions to Alpine Trustees:

- Be sure to check the thermostat is off before departing.
- Be sure to lock all doors upon departure, especially the South door.
- Do not block the North driveway AT ANY TIME. A 12-foot clearance is required to allow neighbor and emergency access.
- Saturday overnight guests do not have a checkout time—they are welcome to enjoy the lodge all day Sunday.
- Unplugging the coffee pot is not necessary and it can be left just as at Echo Lodge (it takes at least 20 minutes to heat up).
- Dishes should be put away, not left to dry after departure.
- The laundry bag has been replaced by a laundry basket under the microwave counter.
- · Basement key is on a hook in the pantry.

This re-route has been under evaluation for many years and finally has the go ahead. The new route is flagged and tread work is now beginning much to the joy of backcountry enthusiasts. When completed in a few years, this change will reduce the visual and noise distractions presented by the highway and the winter play area, thus improving the wilderness experience for hikers and horseback riders. For those familiar with the area, some of the new trail will follow or be near the marked Pony Express route with a ridge separating it from Highway 50.

Our guests enjoyed their unparalleled accommodations at the Lodge; hosted by Hannah Dunton, and Dianne and Jerry Schweickert. All are enthusiastically looking forward to next year's event.
