

Different Hikes for Different Types: Our Weekly Tradition for Sunday Hiking Rain Cancels All Hikes!

Our 2B hikes depart from the California Alpine Club at 9:30AM. These hikes are 7-10 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 2,000 ft. When there is no leader specified for a given Sunday, the convened hikers at the CAC will decide upon their own route.

A more informal, slower paced hike – designated as 1A – will depart from the CAC at 9:45AM. These hikes are typically 5-6 miles long, with an elevation gain of up to 1,000 ft.

Please remember to bring a light lunch and at least a liter of water. All hikers should have prior hiking experience and be able to maintain a moderate pace (i.e., approximately two miles per hour). The hikes usually finish at the CAC around 2–3PM.

Note: Hike group safety protocols prevail. If you want to hike in front of the leader, please inform the leader. If given permission, you must stop at any intersection or junction and wait for the group. You must also be within earshot in case the group is held up. If you do not follow these steps, we will no longer consider you part of the group.

INTO THE GREAT OUTDOORS

May 8-10, 2020: A new trip in development is a three-day canoe trip on the beautiful Eel River with Bob Hanson. This was a popular and fun outing in 2017, when the water was high and swift after a wet winter. Who knows what kind of river awaits after this year's rains? High water or low, we can promise a beautiful river meandering among forests of redwood and oak. There is no outfitter for this section of the river, so paddlers will need to transport their own canoe or rent one at River's Edge in Healdsburg. We will work on a group rate from the rental company for this adventure. Stay tuned for more information as we work out the details.

June 13-19, 2020: Stunning scenery, days of easy floating and wild whitewater paddling, and even some hiking are all on the calendar during this six-day rafting adventure in Utah's magnificent Cataract Canyon. Our host is Mary Larkin-Berlinski and our outfitter, OARS, will fully support the trip, providing experienced guides, all river equipment and of course, delicious and wholesome camp food. The approximate cost is \$1,600-\$1,800 plus travel and lodging (Note: there will be a 10% discount if 16 participants register for this trip). To register, please contact OARS directly. June 22-27, 2020: Relax and leave the world behind on a canoe excursion on the quiet waters of the Green River through Labyrinth Canyon. Magnificent steep red canyon walls, smooth water, wildlife, and solitude are just some of what we'll experience while paddling in this area. The canyon grows deeper with every twist of the river. Cliff walls rise sharply from the river's edge displaying a rainbow of colors with the changing light of the day and breathtaking fiery sunsets. Trip cost is estimated at \$500 per person plus travel and lodging. This trip is limited to 14 or 16 participants. More details will be published in the November Outings e-bulletin.

August 9-14, 2020: Our 2020 mule pack trip will head into the Cora Lakes Basin in the Western Sierras, South of Yosemite. We will meet for dinner and spend Sunday night at the Minaret's Pack Station bunkhouse, then hit the trail Monday morning and hike approximately four miles to Cora Lake. There, we'll enjoy 4 days of hiking, fishing and enjoying the vistas. With numerous hiking options and stunning scenery, this trip, hosted by **Mary Larkin-Berlinksi**, is sure to fill quickly and there will not be a second departure. Trip cost is \$675 and includes one night (with dinner and breakfast) at the pack station, packer fees, and all meals through Friday lunch. August 17-23, 2020: One of the largest high-elevation meadows in the Sierra Nevada, Tuolumne Meadows at 8,600 feet will be our destination for four night nights of camping and five days of hiking Yosemite National Park. **Mary Larkin-Berlinski** is still working out the details so stay tuned for further information in the November Outings Bulletin. The cost is estimated at \$150 per person and the trip will be limited to 22 participants.

September 20-24, 2020: Are you interested in a 2020 trip to view fall colors in Great Basin National Park and Nevada's Ruby Mountains? ECUADOR EXPLORERS ROLL WITH THE ADVENTURE

We expected adventure on the CAC trip to Ecuador, but our troupe of explorers found themselves confronting the unexpected from the minute the plane touched down. As we arrived at the Quito airport, anti-government protests were erupting to challenge the government's removal of fuel subsidies. By the next day, with roads blocked and businesses shut down as a result of the protests, 13 CAC members and friends realized that we were not going to be visiting Quito as planned.

Luckily our local guides were on top of the situation and, for the next week, found great accommodations and destinations for us. We hiked high in the Andes, going from 11,000 feet to 12,300. We rode horses, hiked to spectacular waterfalls, met llamas on trails, and saw amazing plants and flowers.

We descended to 2,700 feet in Amazonia where we stayed in thatchedroof cottages and were treated to a demonstration of local music, dances and Capoeira, a martial art that combines dance, acrobatics and music.

After a day of uncertainty, we found out (yes, WiFi is almost everywhere) that the protests had ended and we could go on to Cuenca, a beautiful colonial-era city, where we stayed in the historic section and were able to visit El Cajas National Park.

Along the way, we witnessed the aftermath of the demonstrations – victory rallies, remnants of huge roadblocks, long lines at gas stations and traffic gridlock near towns.

Thanks to our tour operator and guides, we were completely safe and had an adventure we'll be talking about for a long time.



JOINT WORK PARTY MAKES MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS TO TAHOE TRAILS

Blessed with great weather in early October, the annual work party hosted by the CAC on the Pacific Crest Trail/Tahoe Rim Trail exceeded everyone's expectations. Along with the great work we did on the trail itself, we continued to build relationships with the Pacific Crest Trail Association, the Tahoe Rim Trail Association, and the Forest Service. Staff members from the different organizations directed the work crews, and they reported that the weekend was awesome in all respects.

Thirty-one individuals contributed a combined total of 311 hours of work on the trail and an additional 133 hours of travel and planning time. Most of the volunteers were busy building new trail for the PCT/TRT 1.4 mile re-route to avoid being near Highway 50 and the Adventure Mountain parking area. (See page 9 of the October issue of TRAILS for more information about how the CAC is supporting building this section of trail.)

On the trail, we installed three new rock steps; built additional linear feet of supporting rock wall; adjusted a portion of a rock wall (one very large rock) to allow better clearance for pack animals to get by; and engineered a new shallow stream ford at the beginning of the reroute. All this involved hauling boulders, crushing rock, and dumping dirt; it was strenuous work.

Another group headed over to Echo Lake where the continuously aggressive undergrowth has become overgrowth and is overtaking the trail. Although last year's work party cut back vegetation to a width of 36-48" or more, we found again this year that these healthy plants keep intruding into the trail, so in many places one could hardly walk by without brushing against them. The day's task was a serious attempt to discipline the unruly offenders, especially the invasive silver thorn.

The Echo Summit Lodge Trustees allowed use of the facility at no charge to all guests. Hospitality and meals at the Echo Summit Lodge were provided by **Hannah Dunton** and **Dianne and Jerry Schweickert**. As usual, the new visitors were in jaw-dropping awe of the accommodations, friendly meal service and of course, the view.
